G rard Hopfgartner studied chemistry at the University of Geneva and received his Ph.D. degree in 1991 in the field of organic geochemistry and mass spectrometry. Then he moved to Cornell University as a postdoctoral fellow working on atmospheric pressure ionisation LC-MS/MS. In 1992 he joined the bioanalytical section of F. Hoffmann-La Roche in Basel as the head of the LC-MS group. From 2002 to 2015 he was full Professor for analytical sciences and mass spectrometry in the School of Pharmaceutical Sciences at the University of Geneva and Lausanne. Since August 2015 he is full Professor in the department of Analytical and Inorganic Chemistry of the University of Geneva. His research interests focus on the development of novel mass spectrometry approaches with and without chromatography in the field of life sciences. His scientific interests include separation sciences, mass spectrometry, bioanalysis, metabolism, metabolomics, analytical proteomics, toxicology, multimodal fragmentation and ion mobility spectrometry.
