Nicholson obtained his PhD from St Thomas's Hospital Medical School, London in 1980. He was appointed Professor of Chemistry in 1992 then Head of Biological Chemistry at Imperial College London (1998). Subsequently, Headed Department of Surgery and Cancer (2009-2018) and directed the National Phenome Centre (2012-2018) at Imperial. Currently, Pro-Vice-Chancellor for Health Sciences at Murdoch University he directs the Australian National Phenome Centre in Perth, WA (2019). He focuses on diagnostic molecular phenotyping technologies and is currently working on the metabolic sequelae and long-term complications of COVID-19. "Highly-Cited" Researcher in Pharmacology/Toxicology and Cross-Field (Google H = 162). He won the Royal Society of Chemistry (RSC) Silver (1992) and Gold (1997) Medals for Analytical Chemistry; Chromatographic Society Silver Medal (1994); Pfizer Prize for Chemical/Medicinal Technology (2002); RSC medal for Chemical Biology (2003); RSC Interdisciplinary Prize (2008); Pfizer Global Prize for Chemistry (2006) Semmelweis-Budapest Prize for Biomedicine (2010).
